Part 1

Garbage and Refuse

§101. Definitions and Interpretation. The following words, as used in this Part, shall have the meaning hereby respectively ascribed thereto:

GARBAGE - the animal or vegetable waste from the storage, vending, sale, preparation or use of food stuffs, including but not limited to, meat, fish, fruit and vegetables.

REFUSE - any discarded articles or material, except sewage and liquid waste, and including garbage, ashes and combustible and noncombustible waste.

PERSON - any natural person, partnership, association, firm or corporation.

In this Part, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.

§102. Dumping Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for person to dump any refuse at any place in the Borough or to use or allow to be used as a dump for refuse any lot in the Borough owned or occupied by such person. (Ord. 224, 4/7/1969, §2)

§103. Accumulation of Garbage Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of any premises in the Borough to accumulate any garbage upon or within such premises. (Ord. 224, 4/7/1969, §3)

§104. Unlawful Means of Disposal of Garbage. It shall be unlawful for any person to dispose of any garbage within the Borough by burning such garbage, by burial thereof, or by placing the same in sidewalk waste cans. (Ord. 224, 4/7/1969, §4)

§105. Penalty for Violation. Any person who shall violate any

provision of this Part shall, for each and every violation, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than six hundred dollars, (\$600.00) plus costs of prosecution and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to imprisonment for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues shall constitute a separate offense. (Ord. 224, 4/7/1969, \$5; as amended by Ord. 271, 6/8/1992)
